NSWAPA State Team Selection Criteria for ISSF Matches.

This Selection Criteria will be deemed to have come into effect on the 1 December 2023. The selection period shall commence on the 1st December each year and conclude on the 30th November of the following year.

An Athlete will nominate a maximum Six (6) or a minimum of Four (4) Sanctioned Competitions, during the year, to be considered for Selection for their selection score. The nominated Sanctioned Competition can be submitted to the Team Manager, via email or a phone call, Twenty-Four (24) hours before the commencement of the Competition. If for any reason they cannot attend their nominated Competition, they will notify the Team Manager before the commencement of that Competition.

To be eligible for selection onto the NSWAPA State Team, an Athlete will be required to shoot a minimum qualifying score. All scores submitted will be shot at Sanctioned Competitions. If a submitted score is shot at an Interstate competition, the competition must be conducted to a similar standard to an NSW Sanctioned Competition. When there have been no qualifying scores shot, then, at the Manager and NSWAPA Executives discretion, providing Athletes scores are close to qualifying scores, those scores may be considered.

Minimum qualifying score that must be shot at least once during the Selection Period.

25m Centre Fire Pistol Men 565 10m Air Pistol Men 565

25m Pistol Women 560 10m Air Pistol Women 560

25m Pistol Junior 545 10m Air Pistol Junior Men 540

50m Pistol 540 10m Air Pistol Junior Women 540

25m Standard Pistol 555 25m Rapid Fire Pistol 550

The top Four (4) eligible scores shot during the Selection period will be averaged and the Team will be selected in order of the resultant ranking. This allow Two (2) scores to be dropped. At least one (1) of the six (6) scores submitted must be shot at the Pistol Australia National Championships or a State Championships.

Where an Athlete has been unable to obtain the minimum of six (6) scores the total number of four (4) eligible scores shot shall be averaged. If only Four (4) scores have been submitted by the Athlete, then the average shall include the best and worst of all scores recorded at Sanctioned competitions, both in NSW and Interstate. The Athlete will not be able to start dropping their lowest scores until they have completed six (6) competitions.

The NSWAPA will usually send a Reserve Team Member where an Athlete has achieved this position in at least two (2) matches, or if the National Championships are being held in NSW, for one (1) match only.

Notwithstanding the above, if the Executive considers it is justified, a competitor may be sent as a Reserve for one (1) match only for developmental purposes.

From the Coaching Director

The last year has seen 30 new Club Instructors accredited, with courses conducted at Cessnock, Lithgow, Dubbo, and Lismore, with participants from the surrounding clubs of Bathurst, Blue Mountains, Orana, Cape Byron and Clarence River.

We have conducted Grass Roots sessions for 60 participants at Bathurst, Wyong, Newcastle, Dubbo, and Lismore, with participants from the surrounding clubs of Oberon, Orana, Cape Byron and Clarence River.

Club Instructors Course: The role of the Club Instructor is one of providing information about pistol shooting to prospective members of the Club and this Association. The people the Club Instructor will be instructing may have never handled a firearm or even fired a pistol in a controlled manner. Therefore, it is the instructor's obligation to the prospective individual/s, members, and the Club to ensure they are receiving the correct information on firearm handling, safety and the fundamentals of pistol shooting. The Club Instructor is an additional qualification for members to attain so that they may impart the fundamentals of shooting a pistol in a controlled environment. This formal one-day course covers the fundamentals required to fire a good, controlled shot, and includes areas such as analysis of the individual shot and instructional techniques. This course is a Pistol Australia (PA) National Coaching Council (NCC) accreditation with a card issued at successful completion.

Grass Roots sessions: This one-day training involves theory covering the fundamentals (grip, stance, etc.) through to diary and training. There is a practical session of air pistol, followed by a .22 precision session, then rapid fire stage, and Standard 20 and 10 second stage if time permits. The practical session is tailored for the needs of the group on the day. It is open to members of any experience (P650, Juniors, and up) with the intent to give the participants a good grounding for the club coaches to fine tune, motivate and reinforce.

My role as NSWAPA State Coaching Director is to co-ordinate and assist the coaches to perform their coaching. We have a great team of coaches assisting in this early stage and I appreciate the efforts provided by Allison Doyle (Junior Director & Assistant State Coach) and John Roache (Coach & NSWAPA Secretary).

I am asking for coaches who are interested in assisting us to deliver these sessions, to register your interest by a return email. We can then efficiently role this program out around the state to interested clubs.

I forwarded the February NCC Newsletter to all the coaches I have email addresses for on 6/2/2024, if you are a current coach and did not receive this email, please contact me.

A quick reminder to coaches, all formal sessions must be co-ordinated through the NSWAPA State Coaching Director, assistance and re-imburements cannot be provided without prior approval of the NSWAPA. Records of training are required for all formal courses including attendance registers, session plan, course evaluation, assessment sheets, coaches report, etc. to be lodged with NSWAPA for filing.

How do members or clubs request Coaching or Training sessions:

- Coaching and Training – seek assistance from the coaches in your club, contact your secretary if you don't know who they are (the Coach is required to be active and provide proof of coaching activity to maintain their accreditation).
- For Members and Clubs interested in the 'Grass Roots' or 'Club Instructor' courses, register your interest with the NSWAPA office at (admin@nswapa.org.au).
- For Members interested in the 'Level One' or 'Level Two' coach accreditation or 'Holster' accreditation, register your interest with the NSWAPA office at (admin@nswapa.org.au).

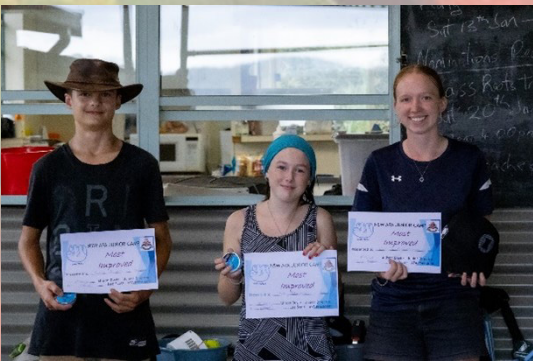

NSW coaching director Jeff Langlands, Junior Coaching director Alison Doyle and Secretary John Roach all attended the event. I recruited World Champion Metallic Silhouette shooter Matt Seears to the coaching team to ensure there was constant one-to-one instruction over the weekend. There was a total of eight juniors in attendance. They ranged in experience from complete beginners through to some juniors having a number of years in the sport.

Juniors and parents arrived on the Saturday morning and we gathered for a group lunch before launching into some reasonably intensive coaching sessions. A huge thanks to NSW APA for supporting the lunch and Newcastle PC for catering. After a briefing session on the structure of the coaching sessions to be conducted we immediately jumped into our first session. Saturday afternoon consisted of two sessions, both running for about two hours each with a break in between.

The first session covered the Standing match. In rimfire Metallic Silhouette the Standing match is shot from the standing position, using a 'Production' category pistol. The rules allow for the use of aperture (peep) sights. Peep sights are a very effective sighting system, and require quite unique mindset to get the most out of it. The juniors took to it like a duck to water and really shot at a level well above their experience. Matt and I were quite surprised at how well these newer shooters were performing. The second session was dedicated to the shooting position of the three other matches. Production Gun, Revolver and Unlimited Gun are all shot from the Freestyle position. This is typically Creedmore or Squashed Frog (yes that's really what it is called). The focus here is to get a stable shooting position and gain and understanding of the relationship of the sights to the target. Wrapping up the day it was clearly an afternoon of information overload, but significant progress was made by all.

Sunday morning started with some air pistol silhouette, supported by a session on the scatt system. The scatt is a great analytical tool to use, and even a number of parents took the time to test their skill on the scatt. Moving onto the rimfire shooting we put the juniors through a number of competition stages to see how well they had taken on the instruction from Saturday's sessions. Standing match followed by a Freestyle match of their choice. Concluding the day, we again joined together for a group lunch before heading home.

Newcastle Pistol Club was chosen as the host range for the event. There are a number of factors favouring Newcastle PC, firstly they are a very supportive club and quite active in the Metallic Silhouette discipline. The range is reasonably central to the juniors in NSW. It is a fully baffled range which is quite enclosed to the point of being virtually weatherproof, so we could go ahead even if the weather was not so favourable.

A massive thanks - to the Newcastle Pistol Club and their members who gave tremendous support to this event, to Matt Seears for his silhouette expertise, to NSW APA and the committee members who were in attendance, to my wife Lesli who did all of the behind the scenes work that you don't see, and to all the parents who supervised, drove, range officered and catered.

Mt Lindesay it NEVER disappoints!

Just because last year had good weather doesn't necessarily mean that this year will as well. As I said, the Mt Lindesay Pistol Club Range never disappoints when it comes to the weather. We headed down early as the forecast was not good. We did a little work until it got too dark to see and called it quits for the night. The next morning dawned clear and really great so we started on the mounds early as we knew that rain was "on its way". By early afternoon, the mounds were chipped and raked, the whipper snipping done and all the targets stood ready for practice day. It started drizzling about 2pm and just keep going – sometimes heavier. It made the already sodden ground mushier and the water laid in puddles in the low spots in the grass. That was it for the day.

With some very heavy rain overnight, the messages and emails began to filter through in the very little service area. 4 competitors had pulled out, 2 were sick and all had been advised by the owners of their accommodation that they probably wouldn't be able to get their vehicles across the creek crossings into the cabin with the rain that was predicted. All but one person camped at the Range and he stayed in the Hotel at Urbenville. With the all weather road into the Range there were no worries about getting in or out anymore, just a couple of muddy, slippery sections to watch on the corners. For all 3 days of the competition we would have quite heavy rain overnight and early morning and on the Saturday and Sunday we even had sunshine which funnily enough made it very hot and humid.

The first day had no actual rain, but the fog and low lying clouds kept rolling through for most of the day. Luckily I had decided to squad half the Field Pistol matches that day (which are much bigger targets) so they were a little easier to see in the dark. The 75m mound / berm seems to be made from a slightly different material and when it is wet it is extremely dark – making the turkeys (no matter what the size) very hard to see against the background. Some reasonable scores were score, with Kim shooting a 37 in Revolver and young Aidan who shot first up in the clouds scored an excellent 29 in Standing.

Day 2 was quite wet to begin with, but if you were lucky enough to be squadded later in the morning, the weather improved and the sun finally came out. Once again Aidan shot early and still managed a 39/40 for Production. He and Kim had a tussle in Unlimited with Kim finishing with 33 and Aidan 34 – good scores in the conditions and the background.

We had some new faces at Mt Lindesay for the first time – Ian Chaplin and then three new Juniors – Chase Ford from Narrabri, Kayla Sinclair from Armidale and Azavier Chaplin from Esk. There were actually three generations of the Chaplin family present – father (Peter), son (Ian) and grandson (Azavier). Seeing this many Juniors at a competition is really good and they are improving each match. Chase and Kayla were keen to try some of the skills they had learned at the coaching weekend that was held at Newcastle just a couple of weeks beforehand – what they had learnt at the camp really came through.

The cloud and fog cleared early on the Sunday and the humidity rose sharply. Aidan managed to equal Kim's 30 in FP Any Sights and then Phil did the same in FP Production with a 25, the same as Judy. This meant shoot offs for both. Phil, Ian and Judy packed all the targets away as the last two on the line worked their way up the range to the 100m Rams. FP Turkeys were left out ready for the shoot off. First up was Aidan and Kim so that Phil and Judy could have a short rest. Kim got the edge over Aidan to take Top Gun in FPAS, It took two goes in the Production category with both Phil and Judy knocking over the last turkey in the first round – they were set up and away they went again. This time, Judy scored 3 and Phil 1, so Judy took the Top Gun there.

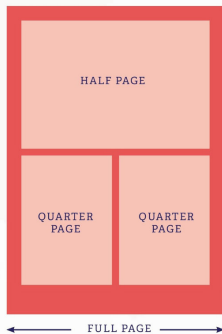

Paul Cole shot a tremendous Personal Best as well today by 24 points!

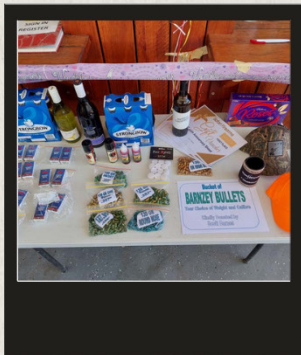
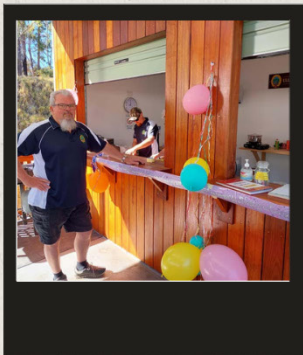
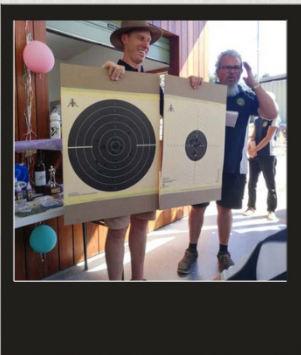
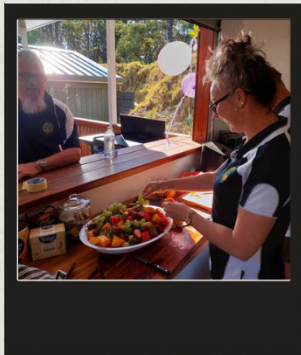
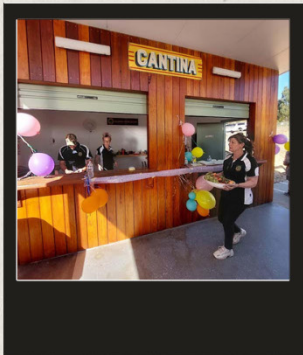
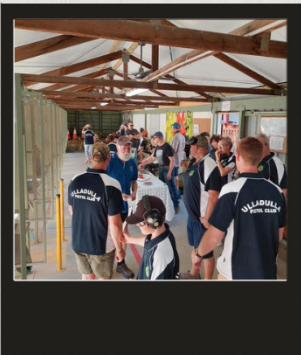
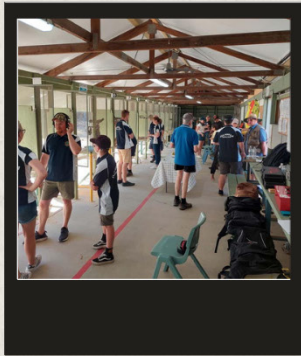
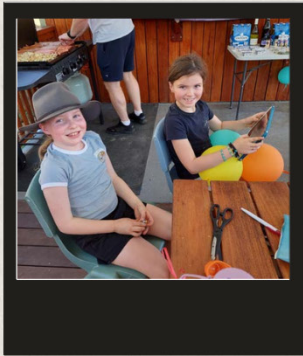
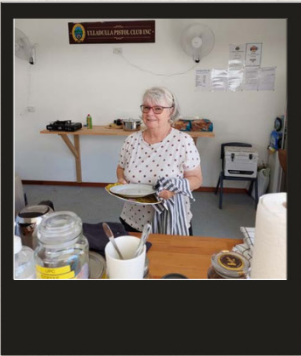
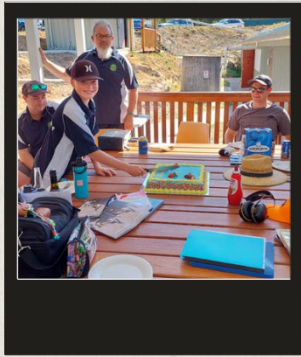
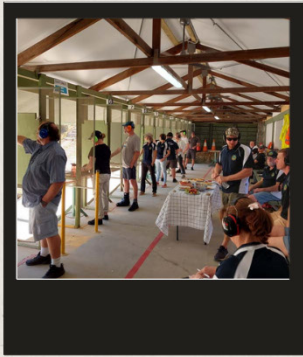
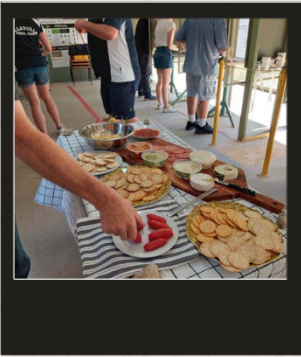

We had a large amount of donated lucky name draw items on a table and every ones name went into a hat and everyone won something and got to choose something on the table.

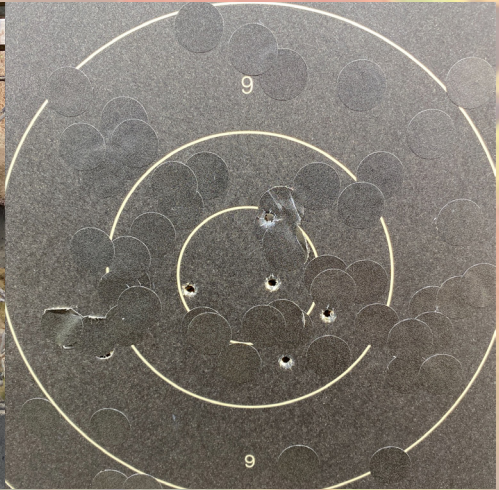
