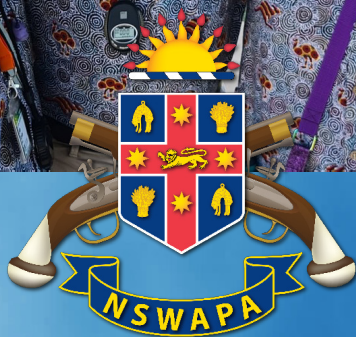

INTERIM STATE REFEREE COUNCIL DIRECTOR



My name is Wayne Unicomb and I was appointed to the role of NSW Referee Council Director on 3rd July 2023 following the resignation of Brian Johnson.

I will be filling that role until all persons of Extra Responsibility are appointed by the NSW Amateur Pistol Association for a further 2 year term in December, 2023 and plan to seek election for a further term of 2 years at that time.

As I see it, apart from the administration duties of the Director, a major part of the role is to encourage and facilitate people statewide to become Range Officers as a first step and ultimately, undertake the work to become a Judge in the various disciplines.

From a personal perspective, I found that I enjoyed my shooting much more after qualifying as a Range Officer and then going on to become a Judge B and subsequently a Judge A.

Mentoring new or prospective Range Officials since qualifying as a Judge B in 2007 has been a personal passion.

We need to attract new Range Officers now as numbers have dwindled Australia wide over recent years.

Qualifying can be achieved in two ways.

Firstly, undertaking the Level 1 Range Officer Course (commonly referred to as Club Range Officer) and then, if desired, progressing through to Level 2 Range Officer which is discipline specific.

Secondly, experienced shooters may wish to undertake the Level 2 Discipline Specific Range Officer course first up and, although there is a little more involved in the Level 2 Course, it is not particularly difficult.

Both courses involve undertaking a theory course via computer and then a theory seminar to review any areas of concern that candidates may have followed by a practical examination on range.

I also believe that we need to encourage new and younger candidates to qualify as Judges. This process is also not that difficult in that experienced Level 2

Range Officers are mentored by an experienced Judge, will work at selected sanctioned events in the discipline Judge B qualification is sort and, ultimately, be assessed by a panel of three judges.

As I work my way into the role of Director, I am very keen to hear from any person wishing to qualify as a Level 1 or 2 Range Officer or Judge "B" in New South Wales to increase this pool of qualified Range Personnel. The plan would be to organize a pool of Range Officer candidates to undertake the training and any Judge B Candidates would be placed with a mentor with the assistance of the National Referee Council Director to progress their training plan.

PA/ISSF NATIONALS DARWIN 2023

After over a year's planning and organizing, and many hours, it was time to pack up and make our way to Darwin for the 65th PA/ISSF National Championships.

It had been 43 years since the Nationals were held in Darwin, and it was with much excitement that the team headed north. Most Team Members opted to fly, however there were a few who decided to drive, myself among them. After packing and sorting the car, we headed off. We were able to communicate and see where other people driving up were up to. After four and a half days, we arrived in Darwin.

First off it was to the accommodation to check all was ok, it looked great. After settling in, we headed out to the ranges to have a look. For me it was exciting to return after so long away, and I was really thrilled to catch up with some old friends.

As the Nationals were going to be shot over two ranges, Darwin Pistol Club and Palmerston Pistol Club, we had to go to both clubs. Firstly, I checked out Darwin and was a little sad to see so much had changed due to the matches are now mainly shot there. However, the ranges we were going to shoot on were very well prepared and we were welcomed by the members.

Then it was over to Palmerston and what a surprise. So much work had been done it was an absolute credit to the members. The ranges were great and well presented, and the Air Pistol Hall, which was air-conditioned, was going to be a pleasure to shoot in.

Friday was practice day in which team members were able to get some shots down and become familiar with the ranges before the competition started.

Saturday was the first day of competitions. It was extremely hot and humid making it a little uncomfortable, however, after that, it was still hot but not as humid. As the matches were going to be at both ranges for the first 5 days, there was a lot of juggling with transport, but everyone was great, and we were able to get through. One day after all transport was sorted every I discovered that I did not have a lift to Darwin, but thankfully, the WA Team came to the rescue and was able to get there.

The PA matches were first, and we saw many fine performances from Team members. I would like to offer my congratulations to Peter Brus, Australian Champion in WA 1500 Revolver, WA 1500 Pistol, Service Pistol and Service Pistol Unrestricted, an impressive performance missing out by 1 point on a clean sweep. Nathan Blackburn Australian Champion in Black Powder 25mt. Congratulations to Dean Brus on his Five Top Ten finishes, Simon Taranto and Martin O'Brien on their Top Ten place. The Black Powder Team finished well, Kerry Bell - 3 rd , Brian Subkey - 4 th , Nathan Blackburn - 5 th and David Moore - 6 th in Black Powder 50mts and Nathan Blackburn 1 st and Australian Champion, David Moore - 7 th , Brian Subkey - 9 th in Black Powder 25mts. The WA/Service and Black Powder Teams finished 4 Firsts and 3 Seconds.

We did have some ISSF matches starting on Wednesday with some 10m Ladies Air, Junior Air and some 50m Pistol. Because of this, we had the whole team there which gave us an opportunity to get a photo of the full Team together.

PA Prestation Dinner was held on Wednesday, at Darwin Pistol Club. A very pleasant night set off with a beautiful sunset. The Aggregate Trophies were

From the Coach

Rapid Fire Match

I have been asked to write you an article about Rapid Fire match. The match has changed somewhat since it's first inception, from having very specialised equipment to now using a "standard" pistol. This article is written very much from my own perspective, and this is a training plan that I use for training the match. Feel free to take the good with the bad, but please do not use this program as gospel, as each person needs to work out a program that works for them.

One of the most important points of rapid-fire match is raising the pistol to the first target BEFORE traversing to the other 4 targets. Read that line again please! The first shot of the rapid-fire series in all timings needs to come from below the 45 degrees to the centre of the first target to deliver the first shot into the X ring, before the recoil recovery and follow through places the sights on the second target for the second shot.

Follow through is extremely important for rapid fire match, as it is for all matches, but in rapid fire it has the added component of traversing to the next target as part of the follow through. An added step in the shot process for the following shots is to release the trigger to re-engage the sear so that you can fire the next shot. The trigger only needs to be let off far enough to reset the sear, it isn't a complete let off from the trigger pressure / tension.

Training for this match is relatively simple. Practice, practice, practice!

First thing to practice is the lift from below 45 degrees to the centre of the target. Not through the centre of the target, to the centre of the target. Once you have mastered the lift without

"bouncing" at the finish of the arm lift, then you can practice traversing to the next target. But before we move to the next target, we need to have our trigger technique perfect to let the shot break at the top of our arm lift (also being the centre of target 1).

To do this the shooter must have trigger pressure on the trigger at the start point of the arm lift. If you are using a 2-stage trigger, some or all, of the first stage should be taken up at the bottom of the arm lift. The second stage is then actioned during the arm lift so that when the arm arrives at the top of the lift (centre of target 1) the shot can/does break.

After the shot breaks on the first target, the whole-body flexes at the ankles just mildly enough for the arm to index to the next target. This means the arm is solid at the shoulder. The body is the turret that allows the arm to traverse across the targets.

Now, once we have mastered the first transition from target 1 to target 2, we must then consider that we have target 3, 4 and 5 to deal with. Once again, each of these shots is performed on the follow through of the previous shot. Follow through of the previous shot is always refocussing on the front sight and functioning the trigger directly to the rear. Many of the imperfections that arise during Rapid Fire are due to trigger function. Second to that, is sighting. One of the biggest parts of training Rapid fire Match is doing it. Putting lead downrange. Without using the timer. Train the technique and perfect the technique.

My preferred way to train is to shoot on

target 1 and 2 only (only loading 2 bullets in the magazine) and having target 3 as a dry fire shot. Once you can reproduce X's, 10's and 9's on the first 2 targets, load 3 shots and have 3 live and 1 dry fire shots. Continue this training program until you can produce 5 shots within the 9 ring every time. Now we can do the above training with the timer. Go back to the 2 shots in the magazine and start on 8 seconds.

Trigger technique....

The trigger must always in any match, travel directly rearward. If you prefer a 2-stage trigger, make sure that you take up the first stage at the bottom of your 45 degrees. Second stage should be activated once you are on the target face. My preference is a single stage trigger, set up much like crisp revolver trigger, but that is a person preference not necessarily a direct recommendation. Some people like "roll off" triggers for this match. There is no advantage or disadvantage with any type of trigger as long as you keep a well trained and well executed trigger technique that does not in any way disturb the sight picture whilst the trigger is being functioned.

Have you noticed something yet?

I haven't spoken about the times at all.

8 seconds, 6 seconds and 4 seconds. More than enough time to fire 5 shots and more importantly, fire 5 good shots. There is also a saying in Rapid Fire Match, that 4 good shots are better than 5 bad ones, which is very true. There is no point rushing 5 shots in 4 seconds if they are 5 shots that are all over the place and have zero good shot processes or technique about them. Timing for the match must come from your internal clock. You must train yourself to have the impeccable

timing that it takes to shoot the match. I suggest that for beginners, use a handheld stopwatch with the big external buttons and practice your arm raises over and over and over until you can get them to about 1.8 to 1.9 seconds. This may sound very slow for a 4 second series, but if you can manage to shoot X's with a 1.8 second arm raise then it is a great start.

Be realistic with yourself. If you cheat yourself in training, then you will be cheating yourself in competition, no one else. There are no short cuts and no quick fixes. Long hard range work and dry fire work at home are the only ways to succeed at anything, but most of all Rapid-Fire Match.

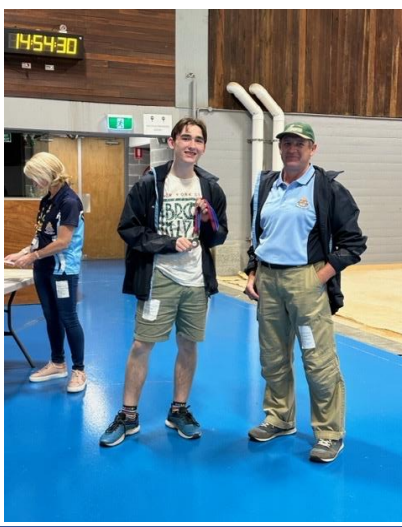
Congratulations Noah, well deserved!

Why Do We Schedule Some Shoots Over 2 Days?

One aspect of our Sport which gives us a sense of enjoyment, is the ability for us to take place in Open shoots throughout our State, and sometimes beyond. These opportunities widen our shooting experience as we visit ranges with different layouts, but they also provide us with the ability to meet and make friends with people who we would not ordinarily meet.

For many years I have participated in many Open shoots outside the Sydney area. This pastime has now become restricted, firstly by age (as I can't drive as far), and secondly by finances (as I am now a Pensioner). I don't believe that my situation is unique – look at the age-related demographic in your Club. I would like our older shooters to continue participating in our sport, and there is one aspect of match scheduling which I believe could be helpful for our older members who are restricted by time and finances to continue competing.

For some time I have been intrigued by how our Open shoots are scheduled. For some reason, our 2-Stage matches such as 25m Pistol, Rapid Fire and Centre Fire are usually scheduled over 2 days. In the past I have enquired from some organisers why it is done this way, and the usual reply is "that's how we've always done it". Is there a reason why we are so set on doing our scheduling in this manner?

The ISSF Pistol Rules (which governs how our ISSF matches are conducted) states:

"All athletes must complete the Precision Stage before the Rapid-Fire Stage may begin."

Rule 8.7.6.4.h There is no mention that they are required to be shot on different days.

At International Competitions, the 2 Stages are shot on different days. For example, the 25m Womens match as scheduled in the recent ISSF World Cup at Baku, scheduled the match:

Thursday	<i>PET 25m Womens Precision (PET- Pre Event Training)</i>
Friday	<i>25m Womens Precision Qualification PET 25m Womens Rapid-Fire</i>
Saturday	<i>25m Womens Rapid-Fire Qualification 25m Womens Final</i>

Each Stage is shot on a different day, but we don't schedule PET at our Open shoots. There is no reason why both Stages can't be shot on the same day, with appropriate scheduling. Note that the Rapid-Fire Qualification and the Final are held on the same day, a few hours apart.

Organisers, why not have a look at making some changes. Consider the possibility of attracting competitors who are time- and budget-poor and can only shoot 1 day. Pensioners are not the only demographic that this applies to. Working people and people with young families are also affected.

This scheduling applies particularly to shoots being held within a reasonable distance from our major population centres – such as Sydney, Newcastle, Wollongong and Canberra, which would allow 1 day participation, including travel and competing.

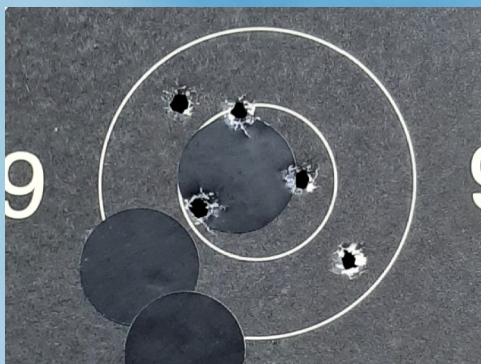

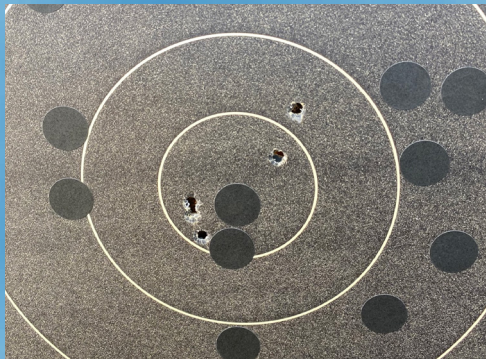


