We have an awesome elite shooting cohort in NSW and thrills me to see such high performance across all grades and matches. It is encouraging to see how

many clubs are interested in holding competitions and we are here to help! Get in touch if your club is considering holding its first shoot and we will make sure it's a raging success.

On a serious note, I would like to re-enforce the message to keep your firearms licence number secure. There have been multiple instances where firearms have been fraudulently acquired from interstate using 'stolen' firearms licence numbers.

To prevent this, I highly recommend:

1. You do not keep your licence on a lanyard around your neck or anywhere else in public view.
2. Only providing your licence when it is legally required eg.
 - a. Your club is required to keep your licence number on file and check it each time you attend the club.
 - b. You will need to produce it for purchasing firearms or ammunition.
3. Please do not include your licence number on noticeboards while selling firearms.
4. Clubs should not include a place to write firearms licence numbers in membership sign-in registers where a picture could be easily taken.

I wish everyone all the best for the remainder of 2023. Please have a safe and relaxing Christmas and New Year and I look forward to seeing you all on a range again in early 2024.

Malfunctions

It has become apparent that an increasing number of Competitors at Open Events do not understand the rules regarding Malfunctions and more particularly, the correct procedure when a malfunction occurs.

The following article is a brief outline on the Rules and the Procedures surrounding malfunctions.

Allowable Malfunctions in the sighting series of ISSF matches are subject to many different and frequently incorrect interpretations.

Put simply, after an allowable malfunction in the sighting series of Rapid Fire Pistol, Standard Pistol or the Rapid Fire stage of 25 metre/Centre Fire Pistol, the Competitor is given another sighting series to complete the sighting series. For example, a competitor has a malfunction after firing 3 shots in Rapid Fire Pistol. He/she is then given an eight second series to fire the remaining two shots to complete the Rapid Fire Pistol Sighting Series.

In the Precision Stage of Centre Fire and 25 metre Pistol, the process is a little different when a malfunction in the sighting series is claimed and confirmed. The Competitor is allowed 2 minutes to complete the sighting series and fire the previously unfired rounds. Most experienced competitors frequently do not claim a malfunction in the sighting series as they have ample time to correct the malfunction or replace the defective round and complete the sighting series.

During the match firing stages of the ISSF matches under Australian conditions, Competitors are permitted: -

- One allowable malfunction in each half of Rapid Fire Pistol.
- One allowable malfunction in the 150 second stage and one allowable malfunction in the combined 20 second and 10 second series in Standard Pistol
- One allowable malfunction in the Precision stage and one allowable malfunction in the Rapid Fire stage of Centre Fire/25 Metre Pistol.

When a malfunction occurs and the Competitor wishes to claim a malfunction, he/she must hold the pistol in a safe direction and, without causing a disturbance to other Competitors, hold out their free hand to indicate that they have an issue and await instruction from the Range Officer. The Range Officer must wait until the series is complete before attending to the malfunction as he/she is responsible for all competitors taking part in that series and match. The competitor may rest the tip of the barrel on the bench for support (although this is not encouraged) while ensuring that the magazine does not contact the bench while waiting for the Range Officer to attend to investigate and confirm the Malfunction cause and decide whether the malfunction is allowable or non-allowable.

Should the magazine be permitted to rest on the Bench, or the Competitor removes the magazine or opens the slide on a semi auto pistol before the problem has been investigated by the Range Officer, the malfunction is usually deemed a non-allowable malfunction (regardless of the initial cause) and no re-shoot or completion of the series is normally permitted.

However, circumstances at the time will determine whether the malfunction is Allowable or Non-Allowable.

The potential causes of malfunctions are many and varied including faulty ammunition, an incorrectly inserted magazine, a faulty or dirty pistol or, the competitor having a loose hold of the pistol as it is fired. The loose hold of the pistol will normally result in failure to feed the next round of ammunition.

Once an allowable malfunction is confirmed during match firing, the reshoot or completion of the series is normally undertaken during the next series of the match as follows: -

- In Rapid Fire Pistol, the competitor will reshoot the series and fire five shots with the lowest value hit on each target scored.
- In Standard Pistol, the competitor will reshoot the series and fire 5 shots with the lowest value 5 shots on their target scored.
- In the Precision stage of Centre Fire and Sport Pistol, the Competitor will complete the series by firing the previously unfired shots in a time of 1 minute for each shot to be fired. All five shots are then scored.

Competitors who are unsure of Malfunction Rules and the correct process to clear a malfunction, should seek guidance from their Coach, a Senior Range Officer, a Judge or a senior and experienced Competitor to avoid inadvertently breaching the rules and having their match score diminished by losing shots through lack of understanding of the Malfunction rules and processes.
